I send you all greetings from the first morning after the blizzard in Chicagoland while Saveun holds down the fort at the DaNgow Church in Phnom Penh. It snowed all night here in St. Charles beginning Saturday evening right through to Sunday midnight yet those who could get out were still in the Churches and those shut in were still in prayer. God bless your faithfulness. I enjoyed a wonderful three weeks in Illinois and Indiana this January and February and was able to visit several Churches in the short time God blessed me to be in the States. I head back tomorrow, 3 February, and will back to preach in the DaNgow Church on Sunday the 8th.

Saveun was able to call me Sunday evening which is Sunday morning in Chicagoland. She was really excited. Her work with the children who have been growing up in the Church for years is bearing fruit. Their Christmas presentation was awe inspiring considering that the youth she works with came to her years ago, poverty stricken, and without Sunday clothes. On Christmas Sunday they presented a recital of Isaiah 7:14 from memory along with a beautiful song which they had been preparing for about a month. Sunday, the 1st of February she called especially to tell me that they had a great Sunday Service and that the work they did on Christmas had inspired parents and children to get into the Church. She reported that they have been having 20 children every day for their Children's Bible study, English lessons, and song practice.
