Saveun and I send you our greetings from the **hottest** month of the year here in Cambodia. We hope you are all doing well in your service to the Lord Jesus in this last month toward summer.

It is very interesting and enlightening to be an active serving Missionary on the field here in Cambodia. As we approach the end of the Church age and look to the calling of our Lord Jesus I am intrigued by how different sincere Christian servants see the soon coming of our Lord in different ways. Pastors see things through the Church and through their communities and often tell me how the things they see indicate that the Lord's coming is drawing nigh.

In the earlier days of our ministry here in the 1990's and into the 2000's we saw phenomenal growth in the work here near Phnom Penh. There were years that we had a solid 300+ souls coming to salvation through the DaNgow Church here and being baptized every year. We even got the gospel out to the provincial capital areas, with most of the provinces being about the area of a county and the entire country of Cambodia being about the size of the State of Illinois. We all rejoiced to see the Khmer people of Cambodia hear the Gospel of Christ and especially since Cambodia had never been properly evangelized in the history of the world. They received their first complete Bible in 1954 but political turmoil and the outset of the Vietnam War followed by Communist regimes denied the people the Gospel of Christ. From 1991 onward however the floodgates opened and Bibles were allowed and we received full permission to bring the Gospel of Christ to the Cambodian People.

Now there is a second shift. It began about two or three years ago. Churches remained solid in the main cities of Cambodia, but there seemed to be more of an emphasis on what appeared to be small outposts of souls still vibrant for the Gospel. This year, and I do mean from January of 2015, the souls in the Village just came alive. It was as if there was a unique moving of the Holy Spirit to reach the most remote areas of the country. At the Annual Mission's conference at Valley View Baptist Church I saw the same. James George's ministry reaching to Abijan, the capitol city of Ivory Coast, but far out into several works in th

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remote regions of the country. The work in Indonesia was presented by Jonathan and Sherri Lunow with their desire and experience to reach into a very remote tribe with the Gospel of Christ.

Recently, I sent some videos in and we have some pictures also posted on the Valley View Baptist website. I must admit that they may look fairly humble as compared to the photos of the Church here with one hundred in attendance. I am however becoming more convinced from what I see and from this new and vital work that our Lord is doing just as he said he would do and that He is now calling us to the uttermost parts of the earth. Those last humble souls with a pure faith in Jesus like our Elephant Story Village Church on a sandy dirt path at the end of a several hour trip from the capitol city of Phnom Penh. What we may be witnessing at the end of the Church age is just as clear and exciting as those who saw the work of the Holy Spirit on the days following Pentecost. We may well be witnessing as the Holy Spirit calls us to the "Highways and Hedges" of the remotest villages. It is always exciting to see these unique works of the Lord in these last days.

God bless you for your prayers and for your love and faithfulness  
that the Cambodian people may hear of the Savior.
