Saveun and I wish you our greetings from Cambodia and hope that you are doing well in your personal service to our Savior. While we are in a bit of a respite from the heat, I saw that even as far north as Illinois there were some days over 100 degrees there in the States. It sure is difficult to carry on when it gets over 100 degrees Fahrenheit, yet somehow the Lord makes it possible.

The work here is going great. We have our twice daily Bible Classes in place, and on Tuesday and Saturday I am teaching and preaching four times a day. Sunday attendance has been filling the Church and we are right on schedule for a good harvest of new souls being saved this year, both here at the DaNgow Church and at the Village Churches.

Saveun and I have been receiving regular nightly phone calls from our Bible School in the Villages. They start their class around sunset with prayer and a song, and we really enjoy hearing their enthusiasm. Pastor Reap had a week or so when his piano was not working. He is too far out for electric service so he uses a solar panel to charge an automobile battery and, in turn, uses that to power the piano. His piano is 9 volts and the car battery is 12 volts so eventually the power supply circuit went out. He finally found a local repairman and has it set up to play again and operate with the 12-volt battery. Working in these villages is very primitive, so we are always thankful to be able to keep things going and growing. They really enjoy having the piano keyboard and it really livens up their song service.

I will be headed out to work in the Villages in early August. It is a several hour trip each way on a very hazardous road. The city-to-city route has everything from ox carts and water buffalo crossing the road, to motorcycles, tractor trailers, and even homemade trucks for transporting dirt and gravel. The village route has some damaged dirt roads and some places require slowing to walking speed to keep on the path.

Thank you for your prayers for traveling mercies as I head out next month and thank you for all your prayers that the Lord would help us do all that he has called us to do for the Cambodian People. It really is exciting bringing the Gospel to these remotest parts of the earth and it really is exciting to have all of you to be a part of it all in praying, in giving, and in your desire to see others come to the saving knowledge of Jesus. God bless your love to the Cambodian People. I hope you enjoy the pictures. Life sure is different here in the uttermost parts of the earth, yet that is where our Lord has sent us. Like the early disciples which were sent by Jesus to go into the villages two by two, we also return with joy after every journey.
